Dr Mireille Toledano

As recently highlighted in our weekly Newsletter we would like to extend congratulations to Mrs Cynthia Toledano whose daughter Dr Mireille Toledano of Imperial College has been appointed to head up an important research project.

Dr Toledano currently leads the UK arm of COSMOS, an international long-term cohort study of mobile phone users. Mobile phones have rapidly become central to our everyday lives. The COSMOS study aims to carry out long term health monitoring of a large group of people so that we can identify if there are any health issues linked to long term mobile phone use. This study has been identified as a priority by research agencies worldwide, including the World Health Organisation (WHO).

The Jewish Chronicle reported that the project is being funded by the government and will track two thousand five hundred 11 and 12 year olds to investigate the effects of mobile telephones and wifi devices on their cognitive abilities (thinking skills, memory and attention). The study will be repeated in 2017.

He has a range of interests from the musical (he plays the piano) to the intellectual (chess) not to mention sport (badminton and table tennis) and of course the technological (computers).

Uri's seudah took place on Sunday 4 May, the actual day of his bar mitzvah. His parents describe the atmosphere as having been wonderfully leibedik and Nechama was touched by how beautifully both Uri and Howard spoke. The following morning Uri was called to the Torah and leyned for the first time. However, it was the next day, Tuesday 6 May that Uri demonstrated a true zeal for his newfound obligations. Despite a

class trip to York Uri arranged with his friends to be up extremely early in order to daven with a minyan. Nechama recounts how this commitment ensured that the occasion of Uri's bar mitzvah was particularly moving for her.

The highlight of Uri's bar mitzvah fell on 10 May when Uri leyned on Shabbos morning for the North Hendon community. His mother recalls a tangible sense of being enveloped by the warmth and support of the entire kehilla as she sat in shul listening to Uri. The Schmulian family appreciated the effort of those who walked from Hendon and Golders Green and were particularly humbled by the presence of Rabbi Yehoshua Hartman. They also commented on the depth of support they received from Rabbi Cohn during the year leading up to Uri's bar mitzva. They emphasised how Rabbi Cohn was on hand for advice on all manner of minute details and how this too enhanced the simcha of the occasion.

North Hendon Synagogue is delighted to wish Uri and his family Mazal Tov; we are sure that he will continue to be a source of nachas to his parents as well as to the wider community.
