- 1. male lamb aged between 8 days and 1 year.
- 2. male bull aged between 1 year and 3 years.
- 3. male ram aged between 1 year 31 days and 2 years.
- 4. male goat aged between 8 days and 1 year.
- 5. Olah entirely burnt on the Mizbeach.
- 6. Chatos some innards burnt on the Mizbeach; meat eaten by the Kohanim on duty.
 7. Shelomim some innards burnt on the Mizbeach; meat eaten by the Korban Pesach group
 - (this is unusual for a Shelomim, which is usually shared with the Kohanim too).
- 8. many individuals would bring a Korban Chagigah on Erev Pesach, in addition to their Korban Pesach.
- 9. throughout the Yom Tov, people would bring their Korban Chagigah, Olas Re'iyah and Shalmei Simchah too.
- 10. on the 16th of Nissan each year, an additional korban of a lamb was offered together with the Korban Omer.
- 11. on Shovuos, additional korbanos accompanied the Shetei Halechem, as detailed in Emor.
- 12. on Yom HaKippurim, other korbanos were also brought by the Kohen Gadol, as detailed in Acharei Mos.
